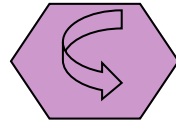

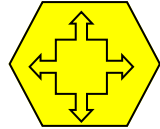
6 Priorities for Improvement

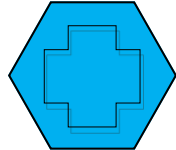
Key Priority 1 – Quality of assessment without levels

Maintaining outstanding progress through the implementation of a new assessment model.
At least 90% of children reach the combined national expectation and at least 40% exceed this.



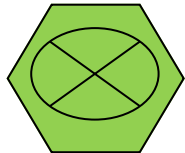
Key Priority 2- Quality of federation/partnership developments

To develop a successful federation/partnership between East Hoathly and Chiddingly to ensure excellent provision and outstanding outcomes for pupils.



Key Priority 3- Quality of teaching & learning

To embed the partnership teaching, learning & assessment framework and ensure that teaching across the curriculum is consistently good with 75% judged to be outstanding by February 2016.



Key Priority 4- Quality of spiritual and cultural provision & promotion of British values

To take deliberate and effective action to ensure the curriculum enhances the spiritual and cultural experiences for all children and promotes high attainment in all areas. Ensure that the promotion of British values is at the heart of pupil's moral and social pupil development.
