Please can sponsor money and forms from the sponsored walk be returned to school as soon as possible.

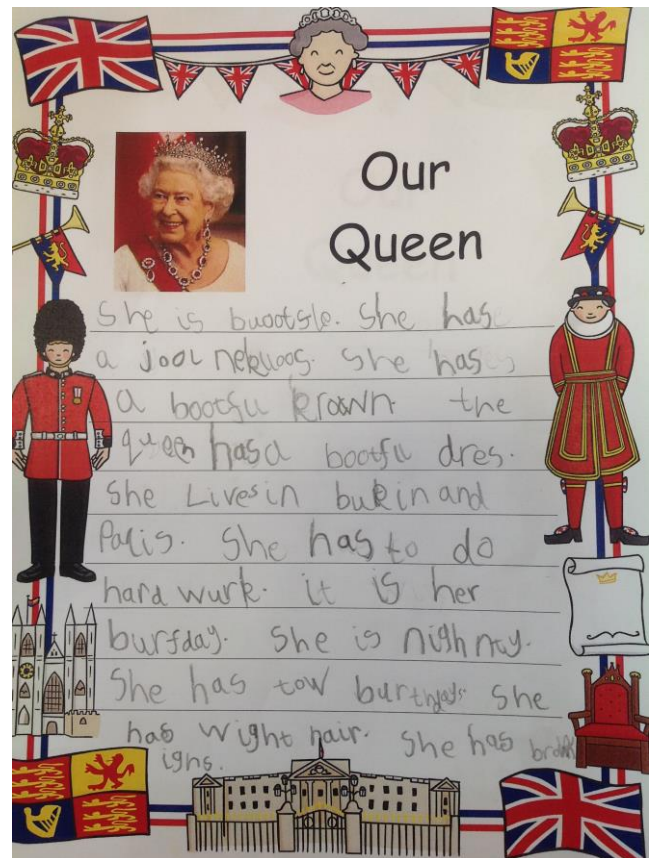


HM Queen's 90th Birthday Celebration

Letter of Thanks

We received the following letter of thanks from Fiona who helped during our Awe & Wonder Day which we would like to share with you.

I wanted to thank you for inviting me to contribute to your 'Awe and Wonder Day' at Chiddingly School last week.

Without the generous help of the staff supporting the felting activity alongside so many parent helpers it would not have been possible.

I was impressed by the enthusiasm of the children, and the support of older for younger ones, as they worked in pairs. Felt making is hard work, laborious, wet and messy but they concentrated for the session and their behaviour was first rate. Most pairs produced a single image following their discussion of colours and image and there was spontaneous consideration shown for others' ideas.

Two groups worked on images of memory of sunset and where this fits with twilight and dusk. The images produced displayed a range of colour. The reverse of the felt was found to be unexpectedly different from the planned image and equally as interesting. Children chose which they preferred to be exhibited. When asked to describe their image in one word a number chose the word 'Magnificent' or similar. It seemed appropriate to the theme.

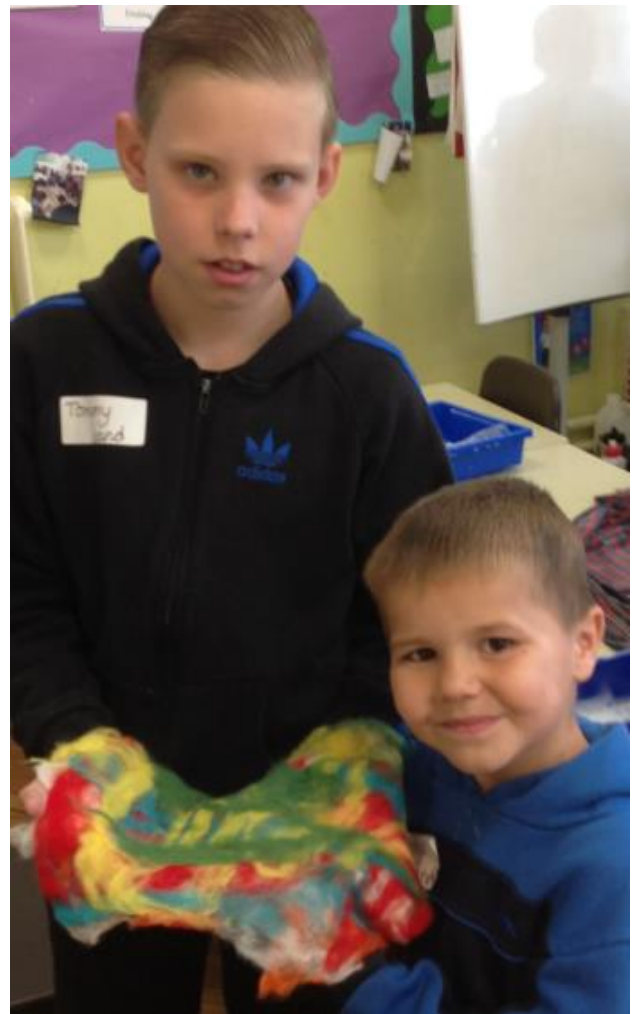
The other two groups worked on images of land, sea and sky.

The results were equally as varied. I showed them how a simple wool circle can become an image of a flower, a pebble, a fish etc. Their work was individual and imaginative; some abstract colours of sea and sky, some objective images.

Without any request, both older boys and girls helped to tidy up.

At the end of the day I enjoyed being part of the school celebration of the workshops and the uplifting theme; the message left a positive feeling of 'Our World'.
