Please remember that Monday 5th September is an INSET day and children should return on Tuesday 6th September.


We hope you have an enjoyable and safe summer and we look forward to seeing you all in September.

School Uniform

Please can we remind all parents of the school uniform policy. Parents will be busy buying their child/children new uniform over the summer holidays ready for September and we just wanted to clarify our uniform policy before this. The uniform policy is at the end of this newsletter. Please can we remind you that children are not allowed to wear boots, trainers or canvas shoes as these items are not part of the school uniform. Shoes must be smart and plain black. Shoes should be leather or equivalent and must not have any logo or trade labels on the outside. Hair which is longer than shoulder length is expected to be tied up, for hygiene reasons. We also expect all pupils to have their shirts tucked in at all times. Socks should be plain grey or black. If any child comes to school wearing the incorrect uniform, parents will be contacted that morning to bring their child's correct uniform or footwear into school. We are very proud of our school and the smartness of our pupils.



School Uniform Policy

Wearing school uniform is important in maintaining high standards and a sense of pride and belonging to the school. There is a formal school uniform, to which children are expected to adhere, and the co-operation of parents in maintaining the standard of dress is expected. Items not available in school can be purchased at any chain/department store, providing they meet the school's requirements. We reserve the right to forbid items of clothing, accessories and footwear that are not on the School Uniform list, or are unacceptably dangerous in school or against the interests of the children at large. Only wrist watches and gold/silver coloured stud earrings are permitted and hair longer than shoulder length should be tied back. 'Extreme haircuts' and washable transfers or tattoos are also not permitted.

Details of the uniform are as follows, please make sure all items of clothing are clearly marked with your child's name – including shoes.

All blue sweatshirts or cardigans must have the school logo on them. These are available to buy from the school office.

PE Kit- white plain PE T-shirts or blue PE T-shirt (with logo) and black PE shorts or plain blue or black jogging bottoms.

Winter uniform is usually worn from the end of September to the beginning of April.

Summer uniform is usually worn from the end of April to the beginning of September.

Boys

Winter - School sweatshirt/cardigan/jumper, pale blue polo shirt or pale blue shirt, grey trousers or shorts, school tie (optional), grey or black socks, and black school shoes.

Summer – School sweatshirt/cardigan, pale blue school polo shirt, short sleeve plain blue shirt, school tie (optional), grey trousers or shorts, grey or black socks, and black school shoes or sandals that cover the child's toes.

Girls

Winter - School sweatshirt/cardigan, pale blue polo shirt or pale blue shirt, grey skirt/grey pinafore dress (must be knee length) or grey trousers, school tie (optional), grey or black socks or grey tights, black school shoes.

Summer - School sweatshirt or cardigan, blue and white striped (or checked) dress, white socks.

Hairbands - should be plain. Scrunchies, ribbons and clips should be white, black or blue (non-decorative).

Non-compulsory items available from school:

Pale blue polo shirt with logo, school tie (optional), school logo PE bag, school logo summer hats, v-neck sweatshirt/jumpers with the school logo.
