Mr Watson is organising a hockey match between East Hoathly and Chiddingly for years 5/6 and 3/4. He is also teaching hockey this term during PE lessons.


The match will be at Chiddingly on Wednesday 19th October and he will promote this as a reward for those making an effort to show good sportsmanship and making an effort with their PE learning.


