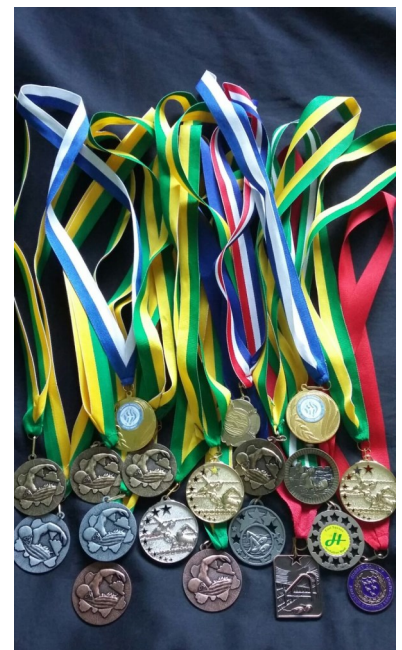
Quinn's resilience and hard work continues to help him build and strengthen his swimming abilities.
