



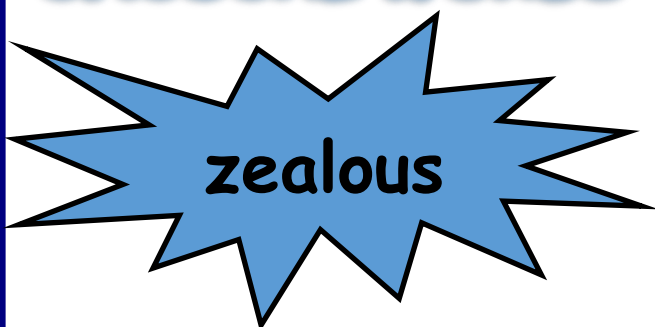

All blue sweatshirts or cardigans must have the school logo on them. Please find the uniform policy attached for guidance on all school uniform.

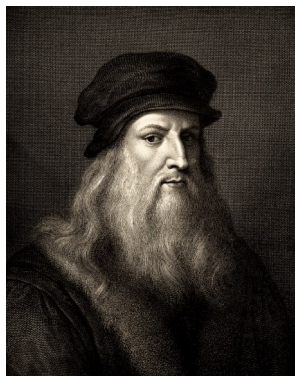

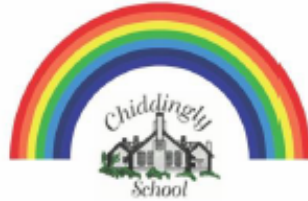

Policy: School Uniform Policy

Wearing school uniform is important in maintaining high standards and a sense of pride and belonging to the school. There is a formal school uniform, to which children are expected to adhere, and the co-operation of parents in maintaining the standard of dress is expected. Items not available in school can be purchased at any chain/department store, providing they meet the school's requirements. **We reserve the right to forbid items of clothing, accessories and footwear that are not on the School Uniform list**, or are unacceptably dangerous in school or against the interests of the children at large. **Only wrist watches and gold/silver coloured stud earrings are permitted and hair longer than shoulder length should be tied back.** 'Extreme haircuts' and washable transfers or tattoos are also not permitted.

Details of the uniform are as follows, please make sure all items of clothing are clearly marked with your child's name – including shoes.

All blue sweatshirts or cardigans must have the school logo on them. These are available to buy from the school office.

PE Kit- white plain PE T-shirts or blue PE T-shirt (with logo) and black PE shorts or plain blue or black jogging bottoms.

Winter uniform is usually worn from the end of September to the beginning of April. **Summer uniform** is usually worn from the end of April to the beginning of September.

Boys

Winter - School sweatshirt/cardigan/jumper, pale blue polo shirt or pale blue shirt, grey trousers or shorts, school tie (optional), grey or black socks, and black school shoes.

Summer – School sweatshirt/cardigan, pale blue school polo shirt, short sleeve plain blue shirt, school tie (optional), grey trousers or shorts, grey or black socks, and black school shoes or sandals that cover the child's toes.

Girls

Winter - School sweatshirt/cardigan, pale blue polo shirt or pale blue shirt, grey skirt/grey pinafore dress (must be knee length) or grey trousers, school tie (optional), grey or black socks or grey tights, black school shoes.

Summer - School sweatshirt or cardigan, blue and white striped (or checked) dress, white socks.

Hairbands - should be plain. Scrunchies, ribbons and clips should be white, black or blue (non-decorative).

Non-compulsory items available from school:

Pale blue polo shirt with logo, school tie (optional), school logo PE bag, school logo summer hats, v-neck sweatshirt/jumpers with the school logo.

PRIVACY NOTICE

Chiddingly Primary School processes personal information about its pupils and is a 'data controller' for the purposes of the Data Protection Act 1998. We collect information from you and may receive information about your child from their previous school.

We hold and use your child's information to support their teaching and learning, monitor and report on their progress, provide them with pastoral care and to assess how well the school is doing.

The information we hold includes you and your child's contact details, national curriculum assessment results, attendance information¹, ethnic group, special educational needs and any relevant medical information.

We will not give information about you to anyone outside the school without your permission unless the law and our policies permit it. We are required by law to pass some of your information to East Sussex County Council and to the Department for Education (DfE).

DfE may also share pupil level personal data that we supply to them, with third parties. This will only take place where legislation allows it to do so and it is in compliance with the Data Protection Act 1998.
