





School Pond

We have used part of our Tesco money to get Pete the Pond to sort out the pond edges; repair holes in the liner; create a natural habitat for the great crested newt; lower the decking for easier pond dipping and put in plants that not only control the duck weed, but also give the great crested newts food and places to lay their eggs.

We are currently looking at using the remaining money to construct a path to the pond and are looking at ways to raise anymore money that may be needed.

We look forward to using the revitalised pond in the future.
