### **Developing Emotional Resilience**

#### The Elephant Brain

When we are working with children we refer to



the limbic system of the brain as the elephant brain. This is where we store and retrieve feelings attached to memories.

This is the second part of the brain to develop. It helps us to remember how experiences and people made us feel. This is the area of that brain that when we feel scared of something will remember how we felt and how we made ourselves feel better.


For example; the child who is scared when told they are about to sit a test. They may feel sick, hot and their heart may be racing (the meerkat brain) but if someone understands, listens and helps them to calm and sit the test the elephant brain will remember the fear but also the experience that they felt ok in the end, the next time they are faced with a test.
