We would like to inform you of a slight change to our leadership structure. From January, Miss Lewis is going to be working as Head of School across all 3 Pioneer Federation Schools.




Positivity Board


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Forest School


After we had finished listening to and discussing the story, the children explored the books in our class library; some children even asked if they could read them with our guest!
