<u>Free Books from The Sun</u>

<u>Norovirus</u>

Norovirus is one of the most common stomach infections in the UK. Norovirus is extremely contagious stomach bug that causes vomiting and diarrhoea. Norovirus is not usually serious and most people recover without treatment in a few days, but it is extremely easy to spread. Symptoms should go away within 72 hours. If your child is affected, please ensure they are kept off school and do not return <u>until 48 hours after the symptoms</u> <u>have stopped</u>, to prevent further spread of the virus. This is for sickness and/or diarrhoea.

The best way to stop it spreading is to wash your hands frequently and thoroughly with soap and water, particularly after using the toilet and before preparing or handling food. Alcohol hand gels don't kill norovirus. <u>Cashless</u>

From Term 3 (January 2020), we will be going completely cashless. This means that for school trips, Breakfast Club, school dinners, etc. you will need to be signed up on ParentPay to make payments via this

We share a new wellbeing poster with you in the weekly newsletter. This week's poster gives us 13 reasons why we shouldn't be afraid to ask for help.





The PFCS would like to thank all parents, grandparents and staff for helping out with the running of the fair. Thank you to Roger aka Father Christmas, Sarah at Layton Premier Properties for the sign boards advertising the fair, to Athena at Asda (Eastbourne) and Jez at Co-op (Horsebridge) for supplying the mince pies. Also to all businesses that helped with donations to the raffle and lastly all the stall holders.

A further £130.76 was raised at the wreath making workshop. Amy would like to say a thank you to Claire from Glenisters Florist in Polegate for running the workshop and Emma at Catsfield Tree Farm, Mike at Old Oak Christmas Trees and Hayley Fitton at The Royal Oak and Castle at Pevensey for supplying the foliage for the workshop.

On Tuesday we had Shooting Stars Entertainment visit the school with the production of 'Mother Goose'. This was enjoyed by pupils, staff and parents and younger siblings who paid a small charge to come and enjoy the performance. This raised a further £11. The PFCS have already booked in next year's visit with them. Finally Amy arranged a cake sale after school on Tuesday with the Christmas items left over from the fair and raised a further £78.32.

Amy will be at Chiddingly Village Market at the village hall this Saturday with other stall holders, selling items for Christmas. Others will be selling jewellery, knitted items, pies, meat, fruit and veg and much more. Please come along and support all the stall holders and get some Christmas shopping done.

Amy kindly agreed to stay on as chair of the PFCS until Christmas but said she will step down as chair from January so we need to find someone to take over the role for the new year. If this does not happen then the PFCS won't be able to continue, which will be a shame for pupils, staff and more. The money raised by the PFCS helps to pay for items not within the school budget. This includes new starter teddies, sports day medals, pantomime visit to school each year, leavers' hoodies, etc. Over the last couple of years the PFCS have also helped with the purchase of an air con unit in Sycamore classroom, a new stage, and new laptops for all the children to use.
