




Year 5 and 6 Term 1 Newsletter The Victorians





Dear Parents,

I hope you have had a lovely summer holiday! Our topic for term 1 is 'The Victorians' and we will be using the text: Street Child by Berlie Doherty. Our topic work this term will be about the Victorians. This will include learning about Queen Victoria, school life, home life, and workhouses.

Please ensure your child's PE kit is always in school; trainers everyday are essential. We will also be in Forest School on Thursday afternoons from Week 2 onwards. Please ensure the children have a their own gloves, waterproof coat, wellies and a change of clothing for this. It would be great if the children could also bring in their own equipment such as forks and trowels as well.

The Great Victorian Bake off – This will be an opportunity for children to sign up to bake something to bring in and share. More details will follow on this...

Home Project – Your child is challenged to make a new invention made from recycled objects at home. They can work on this all term and share it in Term 2 in our Great Exhibition Opening.

Reading	Please read with your child regularly, even if it is just one page. Their books and book bags will need to be in everyday for 1:1 reading. You may like to add a positive or helpful comment in their reading diary, but please acknowledge the fact that the book has been read by signing and dating in the comments space. A member of staff will be checking homework diaries on a Friday and children are expected to have read at least 3 times a week with an adult. If they have, your child will be recorded as reading on the class chart. The winning class will get a trophy and book for their class to read that week.
Spellings	Spellings will be sent home on a Monday and tested the following Friday .
Maths	Year 6 - Using the CPG Mathematics Arithmetic book – teachers will set work once a week Year 5 – My Maths online learning will be set This will be set on a Monday and due in the following Friday.
Grammar	Using the CPG Grammar book – teachers will set work once a fortnight for both Year 5 and Year 6. This will be set on a Monday and due in 2 weeks later.


Helping to enrich our topics
