## Welcome Back!

A warm welcome back to all our families! We hope you had a lovely Summer Holiday! It's been lovely to have the children back in school and catch up with them all!



We wanted to take this opportunity to thank everyone for keeping to our new routines and system for pick up and drop off. Please could we remind everyone, that it is essential that parents continue to socially distance and ensure you are vacating the area immediately following drop off or pick up.

As part of the new routine, we have been asked by the Council to report any absences (COVID or non COVID related) and they have asked that we share the below with you:

Sharing Information The government expects:

- $\cdot$  schools and local authorities to:
- Promote good attendance and reduce absence, including persistent absence;
- · Ensure every pupil has access to full-time education to which they are entitled; and,
- Act early to address patterns of absence.

 $\cdot$  Parents to perform their legal duty by ensuring their children of compulsory school age who are registered at school attend regularly.

 $\cdot$  All pupils to be punctual to their lessons.

The Local Authority has a duty to support schools to meet these expectations and to support schools, parent/carers and learners to address patterns of absence in a timely manner. The government is also asking schools and Local Authorities to identify pupils who are reluctant, or anxious about returning, or who are at risk of disengagement and develop plans for re-engaging them. This should include disadvantaged and vulnerable children and young people, especially those who were persistently absent prior to the pandemic or who have not engaged with school regularly during the pandemic. We will therefore be sharing information with the Local Authority regarding any pupils about whom we have attendance concerns in order to fulfil our statutory duty.

Today you will have received two letters, one detailing the protocol we will follow if we have a suspected or confirmed case of Coronavirus and the other an example of the letter we will send.

We are also sending your children home with Data Collection sheets, please could you amend them if you need to and return them to the School Office as soon as possible and by the end of next week.

We hope everyone has a lovely weekend and look forward to seeing everyone next week!
