McKenzie made a beautiful Chinese lantern!






Beech

They are uploading videos to it daily that are suitable for 5-11 year olds.



Captain Sir Tom Moore Challenge

Captain Sir Tom Moore, who provided us with so much inspiration during the pandemic has sadly passed away this week. The army veteran became famous after he raised millions of pounds for the NHS by walking 100 laps of his garden before his 100th birthday!

A little bit of background



Captain Sir Tom Moore served in the British Army during WW2 and rose to Captain during his time with the Army.

In April 2020, Captain Sir Tom Moore, decided to try to raise £1000 for NHS charities by walking 100 laps of his garden. After an incredible show of support from everyone around the country (and the world!) he raised £33 million!

On his 100th birthday he received over 150,000 birthday cards from people all around the world!

The Queen knighted Captain Sir Tom Moore at

a special ceremony last Summer!



Captain Sir Tom Moore shared his thoughts during the pandemic and we would like to share them with you now:

'We will get through it in the end but it might take

time, at the end of the day we shall all be ok again...the sun will shine on you again and the clouds will go away.'

We think the resilience and strength shown by Captain Sir Tom Moore is amazing. We would like you to spend a little bit of time over the half term thinking about what Captain Sir Tom Moore achieved. What can we learn from Captain Sir Tom Moore? What do you think he will be remembered for? What do we know about him and his achievements? Do we know much about him before he raised the money for the NHS?

Finally, can you set yourself a challenge of doing something 100 times to raise awareness of something you care about? Play Like Share Resource for 8-10 year olds

Video to show the importance of parental controls and restrictions

The world changes, children don't! Romeo and Juliet taught us that!

Children online:

The internet and children's online lives can feel very overwhelming for parents and carers. New Apps and games appear every day and with them, new risks.

When supporting your children online, ask yourself these questions:

What can they see? Is it appropriate? What are the security, filtering and privacy settings that can be used? What are they sharing and who with?

Who are they friends with and what are they chatting about?

What can parents do?

Talk to your child – make this an ongoing conversation – not a 'big chat' but part of your daily conversation about decision making and choices. Talk about what they like to watch, play and do online. Watch videos and play the games together and talk about what the risks could be and how to combat them. Ensure they know what to do if something makes them feel worried, upset or scared.

Look up the age ratings – check them as a guide to whether the content is appropriate.

Set up privacy, security, parental controls and filters – this will help you to manage the content they might see and block obvious adult content. This is not 100% proof, however, so monitoring will still be required.

Encourage reporting – show them how to report inappropriate chat within a game and to tell you if anything makes them worried or uncomfortable.

Use devices in public spaces – don't allow children to stream from bedrooms or bathrooms **Support and report.**

Be a good role model – consider your own use of the internet and devices – what are children learning from you and modelling their own behaviour and habits on?

Resources

<u>Jessie and Friends</u> is a series of three animations for 4 – 7-year olds. The series follows the adventures of Jessie, Tia and Mo as they begin to navigate the online world, watching videos, sharing pictures and playing games. There's also a storybook for each episode, to help you and your child keep the conversation going, and a catchy song at the end, aimed to reinforce the films safety messages.

<u>Play Like Share</u> is for 8 – 10-year olds. It follows the adventures of Alfie, Ellie and Sam as they form a band and enter their school's Battle of the Bands contest, taking on the mean but 'cool' Popcorn Wizards as they go. The three friends learn that while the internet can help, they need to use it wisely and safely. The films teach children how to spot the early signs of manipulative, pressurising and threatening behaviour by people they might meet online and develops their confidence to respond safely and get help.

Google Classroom Timetable

8.30-9.45am

15 minutes 'live' morning registration with Class Teacher and Teaching Assistant. All children should attend and teachers will take a register. They will also share the overview of the learning for the day. These sessions are staggered to allow for families to share devices. Children should be muted and only 'unmuted' to allow for specific questions.

8:30-8:45am	Year 5 and 6
8:45-9:00am	Year 3 and 4
9:00-9:15am	Year 1 and 2
9:15-9.45am	Reception (live phonics lesson included in this session)

During hours of the school day

Children to complete the learning activities. This will include the following:

Daily pre-recorded phonics for Year 1 + 2 (aimed at Y1 level).

Daily pre-recorded Maths (all classes) and English (Year 2-6) learning session (led by a teacher or using Oak Academy Trust resources)

1 daily topic-based lesson – this will either be a pre-recorded video or resources with clear instructions.

Pupil support sessions

The Class Teacher and Class Teaching Assistant will hold a live Google Meet for one daily session for have a general question and answer slot from pupils and parents. There will always be two members of staff in these sessions and we would advise parents to also be part of these to ask any questions.

If teachers identify that pupils require 1:1 or small group tutorials, they will arrange these with individuals.
