
# <u>'Toys'</u> Beech Newsletter Term 1 2022


Dear Parents,

Welcome back, we hope you have all had an enjoyable summer. Will be starting our year with a topic all about toys. The children will be learning about the history of toys and finding out about the changes that have occurred over time and why. Alongside this they will be learning about the materials that are used to make toys and also design and make our own toys.

### Reminders

Please make sure the toys, work, photos, objects are clearly named.
- Fruit for Key Stage 1 is provided for snack time, however if you want to provide a snack for your child at this time, please make sure it is a healthy snack.

## **Home Learning**

If you would like a learning activity to complete at home during this term with your child, you can choose from one of these activities:

- Ask a family member about the favourite toy they had when they were younger, why was it their favourite?
- Play a board game with members of your family, how has how we play games changed?
- Have a go at making your own board game.
- Design a new toy, what would it be like?

Reading	We are very excited to be sharing our new reading scheme with you. Please look out for a meeting about the new scheme, if you are unable to make it we will be sending home information about it.
Phonics Year 1	Children in year 1 will be sent home with a phonics homework sheet on a <b>Monday</b> which will share the sounds, sentences and spelling we will have covered during the previous week. The children can share their learning with you. There isn't a formal spelling test in Year 1, however there will always be 5 words at the bottom of the sheet that they have learnt in school that week and it would be great to practise these at home too! Their phonics and spellings all fit in with the new reading scheme.
Phonics/ spelling Year 2	Children in Year 2 will be sent home with spellings based on the spelling rules they will have been taught during the week on a <b>Monday</b> , they will be tested on these on the following <b>Monday</b> . To begin with they recap the alternative spelling patterns for the sounds they learnt in year one, then they move on to rules within spellings.
Maths	Maths homework will be set from a new CPG book. It will be set on a <b>Monday</b> and need to be returned on the following <b>Monday</b> . The children can bring it back in whenever they have finished it during that week and put it in the 'finished homework' box.
