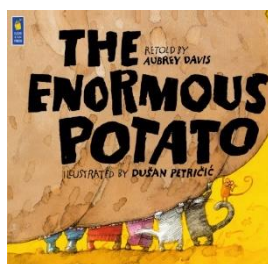
Beech Class Newsletter Term 5 2023

Questions to ask at home:



- What is healthy food?

- How do plants grow?
- What do bees do?

Home Learning Tasks

You could have a go at some of these at home:

- Cooking some yummy healthy food
- Planting seeds and watching them grow (cress is always good!)
- Drawing the life cycle of a plant
- Designing and making a plant habitat from recyclable material
- Design your own farm to grow foods
- Go on a walk around your village/town and draw or write what you see. What is old/new?

Home Learning

Reading	Please read at least 3 times a week and record this in your reading records. We collect the reading records in on a Friday. This can be books, comics, internet articles, newspapers, instructions, recipes...!
Phonics Year 1	Children in year 1 will be sent home with a phonics homework sheet on a Monday which will share the sounds, sentences and spelling we will have covered during the previous week. The children can share their learning with you. There isn't a formal spelling test in Year 1, however there are 5 words at the bottom of the sheet that they have learnt in school that week and it would be great to practise these at home too! Their phonics and spellings all fit in with Little Wandle scheme we follow at school.

Phonics/ spelling Year 2	Children in Year 2 will be sent home with spellings based on the spelling curriculum rules they will have been taught during the week on a Monday , they will be tested on these on the following Monday .
Maths	Maths homework will be set on a Monday and needs to be returned on the following Monday . The children can bring it back in whenever they have finished it during that week and put it in the 'finished homework' box.

- Please can you make sure your child brings in a **water bottle** and their **book bag** each day.
- Please can you make sure that **ALL CLOTHES** has their name inside. Things get lost when getting changed for PE if they are not named.
- The children will need to have a **coat** in school every day as the weather can be unpredictable.
