Dear Parents and Carers,


We hope you have an enjoyable half term and are ready for our final term in Reception, before moving to Year 1!

This term, we are going to enjoy a water filled fun learning journey. We will be enjoying finding out about how essential water is, where it comes from, what we need it for and how we can look after our water sources. Our journey will also have some pirate fun including a pirate day! (More info to follow).

Our key texts this term will be:







Areas of Learning:

Literacy - We will be continuing to focus on using high frequency words in our writing as well as spelling words with more than one syllable. We will be writing our own stories based on the texts we are reading, as well as looking closely at the characters, settings and events of the stories we are sharing. Another skill we will develop is giving opinions and views about stories we have shared.

Maths - In Maths, we will be solving problems that apply all of the skills we have learnt so far. As well as this, we will be continuing to develop our knowledge of number, practising doubling and halving and recognising and ordering 2-digit numbers. We will be learning about money, comparing and estimating piles of pirate treasure! We will continue to think about multiples and using 2's, 5's and 10's.

In other areas of the EYFS, we will be making links with our water theme, such as learning about things that float and sink and why this happens. Our Personal, Social and Emotional Development will begin to focus on our transition to Year 1 and we will be taking part in lots of activities which make us more familiar with the children in Beech Class already, as well as exploring our new surroundings and routines, ready for September. The key to a successful transition to Year 1 is when children feel that this will be a positive experience and we aim to fully support them in this process. If you have any questions about this, please do not hesitate to ask.

### Home Learning

We would like to thank you for your effort with last terms home learning tasks including reading with your children. This is something that is so important for your child. Not only for developing their reading skills but also many others for example their writing, communication skills. Please make sure you are reading with your child at least 3 times a week and record this in their reading record. This is something we look at on a Friday to collect the class reading score. Please also continue to read through the summer holidays to support your children before their transition into year 1.

Reading -	Please read with your child regularly, even if it is a home or library book. At this stage
Letters and	it is really helpful to discuss the stories that you read and use story language such as
Sounds	character, setting, beginning, middle and end. Please encourage your child to predict
	the ending of the story and give their opinion of the texts that they read. Please
	record their ideas either in their reading record or their home learning books.

# Splashing Home Challenges!

If you want to further your learning at home, you might like to try one or more of these challenges:

- ♣ Paint a picture or make a collage of an under the sea image. What can you see under the sea?
- Design your own pirate ship or pirate flag.
- Write your own pirate or sea character themed stories.
- Create your own amazing lunch and design a menu for your family. Take photos of your meal to share with your friends.
- ◆ Use Lego or another construction kit to build an amazing ship or boat.
- With an adult's help, find some objects around your house and test to see whether they float or sink when you put them in water. See if you can predict first what you think will happen and then see if you were right!

We are hoping to go on a class trip to the Blue reef aquarium in Hastings and visit the life boat centre while we are there. We will also be having a Pirate Day this term where we dress up and take part in a wide variety of pirate themed activities. More details for both events will follow shortly.

#### Quick Reminders

- Please can you make sure your child brings in a water bottle and their book bag each day. It is really helpful if the water bottle is full, with nice fresh water, when it arrives at school.
- Our PE day is Tuesday but PE kits should be in all week.
- Sunhats are essential in the warmer weather when we are outside for longer periods of time. We
  are not permitted to apply sun cream to any child, so children must have it applied before they
  come to school.
