Let's Celebrate!




Dear Oak Families,





Home Learning

I would like to thank you all for your effort with last term's home learning tasks including reading with your children. The children have already made great progress with learning sounds and every read will help this to become more secure.

| Reading | Your child will bring books home each week. One of these books will be a Little Wandle book and it will remain the same all week. The idea is that it is read repeatedly to give your child confidence and fluency. The other books will be more regularly changed. It is essential that the book wallets are returned each day as we will be using these books in reading sessions. |

We have noticed that those children who are aware of the sounds that we will be covering benefit greatly from this knowledge. |
| Maths | We will be using CBeebies Number Blocks to help with our teaching of number. We will be starting with '6' and then taking a different number every week to understand the value and embed foundations. Other maths activities will be taking place at the same time. This is part of the recommendations from the Maths Mastery approach. |
