

<u>Oak</u>

Oak Class are speeding through their 'Off We Go' topic, looking at the story of 'The Naughty Bus' and making up our own cheeky adventures! We have also learnt about different vehicles, how they move and where they go, and how they benefit the emergency services and the different 'people who help us'. We have been role-playing different important roles: police, military, bus drivers, postal service and firefighters, and exploring the different ways they help our communities. Alongside helping others, we've been looking at how we help our own bodies be the best they can be, and how to keep them healthy - thinking about healthy food choices, sleeping, exercise and kindness.







<u>Beech</u>

Beech Class have had an exciting start to the term! They found an egg and have made a lovely warm home to keep it safe until it has hatched! This links to our book 'The Emperor's Egg' that we will be reading in English. They also had a fascinating visitor from Miss Eldridge's daughter. She talked to the children all about her travels around the world and her work with animals. The children were extremely interested in her pictures and had some interesting questions for her. This visit linked to our Geography where we were exploring animals from different continents. In DT, the children have started a unit where they will eventually be using clay to create their own sculptures and in Maths, year 2 have been learning about money and year 1 have been learning about numbers to 20. They are all amazing mathematicians. Well done Beech Class!












<u>Willow</u>

At the end of last term, we had a special visit from Santa! Thank you to the PFCS for showing him around the school, so he could give each class some presents to share in the classroom.








New Reading Incentive

We hope that all the children enjoyed the event and look forward to our Easter Fun Run in term 4!












