## Class Updates

## Oak

Oak Class has been busy exploring knights and dragons, focusing on different texts - we have written letters to dragons, dressed up in armour, written our own stories, painted dragon eyes, created fairy tale maps and built castles inspired by photos of those around the world! We were also lucky to have 'bikeability' visit us and teach us various skills on balance bikes. Across the week, we managed to build up the skills for everyone to ride pedal bikes, without stabilizers! They were so proud of their progress, as were we! To keep our physical development strong, we've also kindly had a parent volunteer to teach us some yoga, which they loved exploring under the sea poses! Amongst this, we have been consolidating our number bonds to 10 , looking at addition of up to three numbers, which they have really challenged themselves to succeed.


## Beech

Key stage 1 and 2 started World Book Day with an online story workshop hosted by the British Library.
They took part in story telling and creating their own fairy tales with thousands of other children across the UK. Beech Class particularly loved storytelling with Michael Rosen and watching Allen Fatimaharan illustrate as the stories were being told.


## Willow

Willow Class have been studying plants in science this term. Last week they were learning about how roots work, they went up to the vegetable patch and helped out by pulling up lots of the weeds. They had to do it very carefully so they didn't rip off the roots. They then took them back to the classroom and compared the size of the roots to the size of the plant.


## Sycamore

Last term a Pupil Voice was taken from members of the school and members of Sycamore stated that they took pride in seeing their work displayed in class. At the beginning of Term 4 we created our 'Sycamore Superstars' board which is now displaying fantastic examples of persuasive posters, descriptive poetry, detailed History work and superb Science efforts!

What an amazing turn out on World Book Day this year. The children all dressed up as their favourite characters and the staff dressed up as famous people from "Little People, Big Dreams". We had some really creative and varied costumes this year and it was brilliant to guess who everyone was.


## Forest School (last week)

Oak Class embraced the wet weather and enjoyed the puddles and streams of Hoad's Wood, taking turns to jump into the 'pools' we dug. If we weren't swimming in puddles, we were climbing trees and building dens.
