







Beech

In Beech, we have been learning about explorers; in particular Christopher Columbus. We have learnt about how he became an explorer and all about his first expedition which we story mapped in groups. In maths, Year 2 have finished learning about statistics and did some work on word problems whilst Year 1 have finished multiplication and division. Both year groups have now started work on fractions thinking about equal parts. During Science and Forest School, the children built their own wormeries and made a wonderful habitat to observe the wonder of the worm! (see the Forest School page). We are also just starting to write our own stories based on the book 'Journey'. Watch this space for some budding authors!









Willow

Willow Class have been listening to and creating their own music inspired by a river. They have experimented with different percussion instruments to see what sounds they can make and are now planning their own piece inspired by Smetana's 'Vltava'.

They have also been learning about different trees and how to classify living things. They went for a walk around the school grounds to see what trees they could find and see if they could name the trees based on their leaves.












Sycamore

Sycamore Class have been adding to their 'Sycamore Superstars' board with excellent examples of work from Science, RE and a continuation of our narrative work from the book 'Varjak Paw'. The class also got artistic in Music recently where they listened to music from the Romantic period of music and created a piece of artwork which shows how they feel about music.





Forest School

Beech Class enjoyed a range of activities in Forest School the past 2 weeks. Last week, we went to the local forest and did bug hunting, tree climbing and den building. This week we did more pond dipping and found salamanders and dragonfly larvae, as well as building our own wormeries! The children built them a habitat and found some worms to keep in there for the next couple weeks whilst we thought about interesting questions we would like to know about worms. Ask your children what they have learnt about them... I bet they will surprise you with some facts!


CLASS & CLASS+ Parent Transition Workshop
