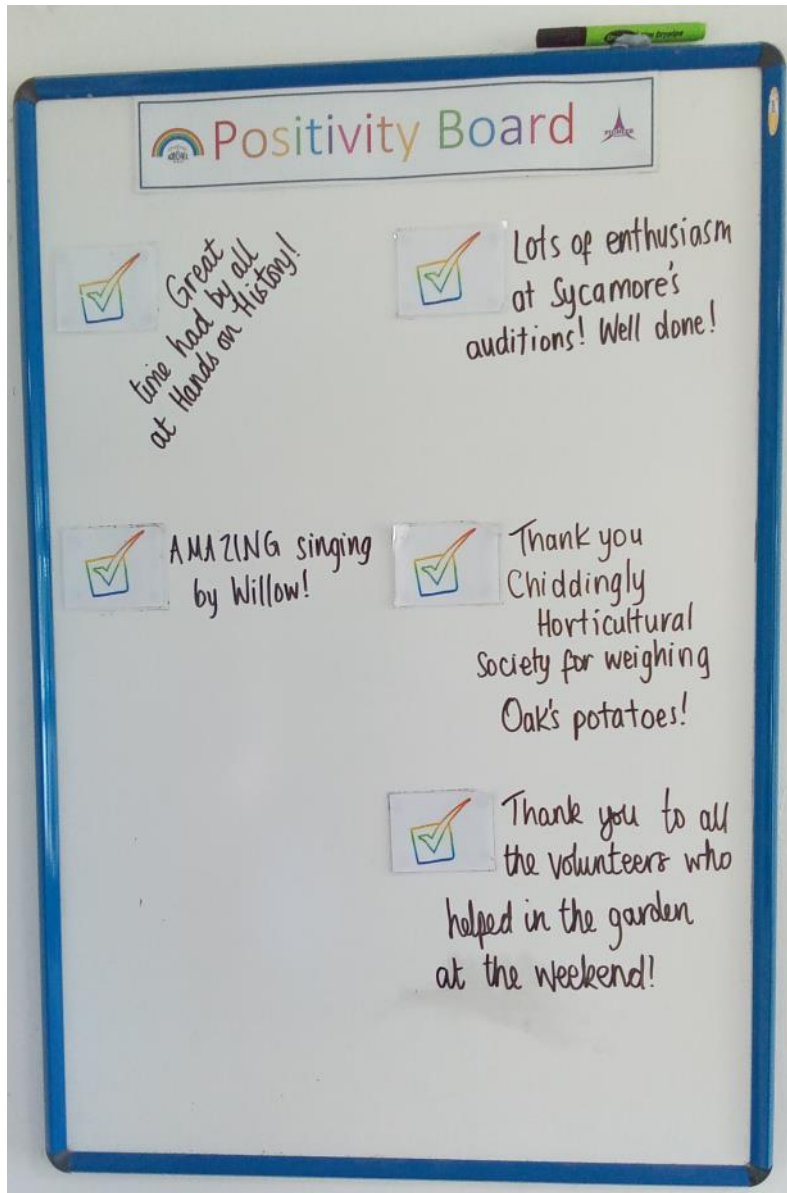

***Don't forget to bring something Hawaiian or bright and colourful to wear whilst performing the Active Mile Fun Run!**

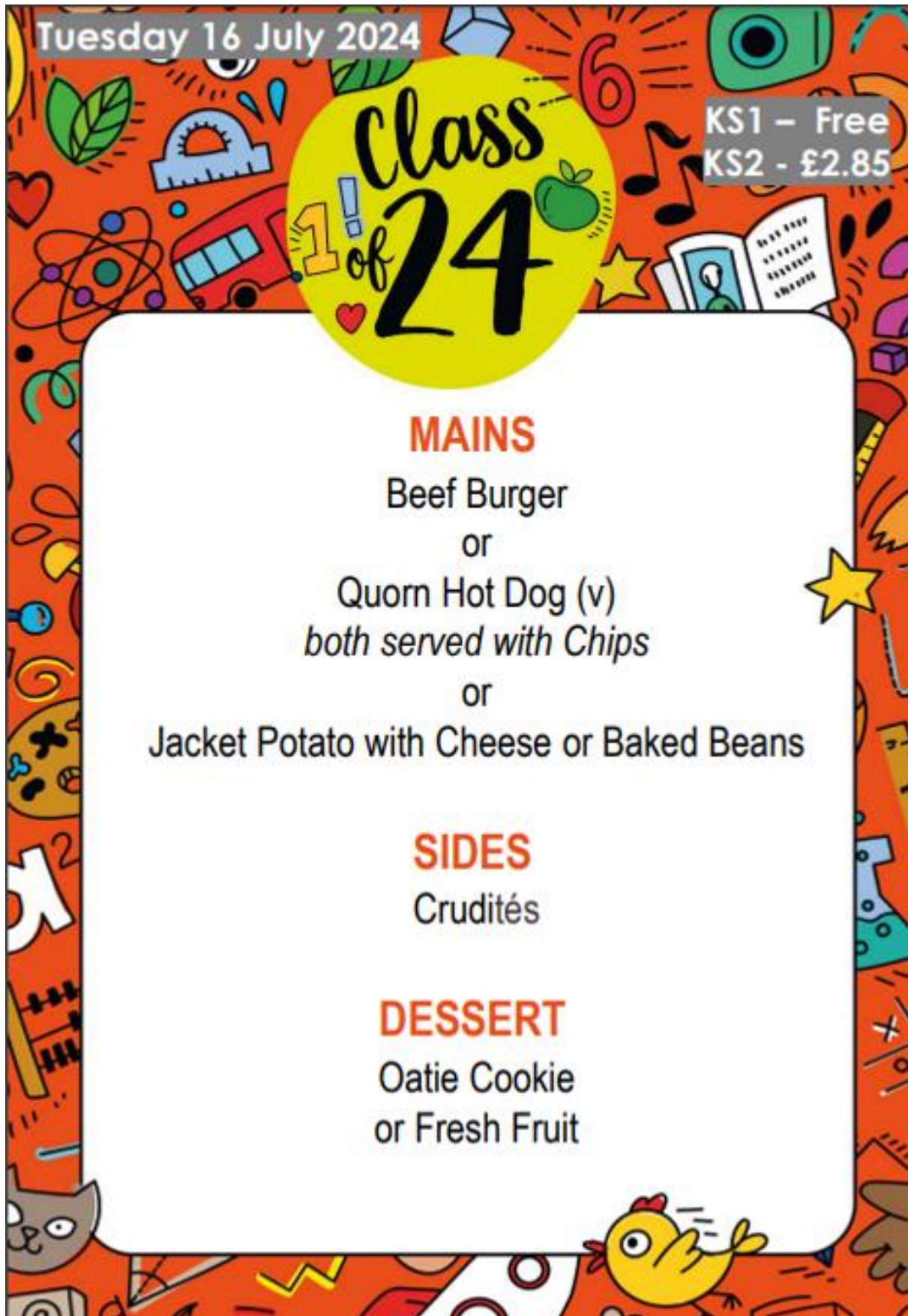
ICE LOLLY REFRESHMENT

Volunteers needed to help the NSPCC share vital messages in primary schools across East Sussex

Could you spare just a few hours each month to help the NSPCC keep children in East Sussex safer?



The charity's Schools Service delivers **Speak out Stay safe** workshops to primary schools across the region and needs more volunteers to help reach more children.

Speak out Stay safe is designed to help children recognise abuse in all its forms. Using age-appropriate language, it helps them understand that abuse is never a child's fault, that they have the right to be safe, and how to get help from safe adults or the NSPCC's Childline service.

Since the start of this academic year, across East Sussex alone over **4000** children have taken part in the **Speak out Stay safe** workshops! And the organisation wants to reach even more children throughout 2024 and beyond.

Jermaine French, NSPCC Schools Service Coordinator for East Sussex, says: "We would love to hear from anyone who can spare just a few hours each month to help share vital **Speak out Stay safe** messaging with children and young people across the region. We are looking for *enthusiastic, energetic, and empathic* volunteers who are passionate about children's rights."



"Our volunteers have told us they consider it a privilege to raise children's awareness of their right to be safe, and many feel that through the Schools Service they have also gained a sense of pride, confidence and empowerment by delivering these workshops and sharing this important messaging."

Schools Service volunteers are required to give a minimum commitment of visiting two schools a month on average (term time only). Full training and ongoing support will be provided.

If you are interested in volunteering as a **Speak out. Stay safe.** volunteer and want to find out more about the role, the next step is to attend a virtual **Volunteer Information Meeting (VIM)**. Our meetings are designed to help you decide whether you want to apply – there is no obligation or expectation that you will apply if you attend one.

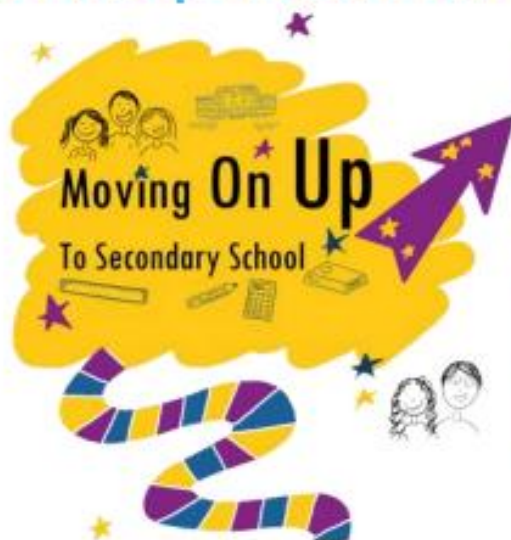
CLASS & CLASS+ Parent Transition Workshop

Emergency First Aid



Emergency First Aid course at Chiddingly School

I am delighted to be running a **Level 3 - Emergency First Aid course at Chiddingly School** split over two evening sessions from 6-9pm on both **Monday 24th June and Monday 1st July 2024.**

This 6-hour course provides learners with the knowledge and practical competence required to deal with a wide range of First Aid situations including **Child and Baby First Aid.**

The training also provides delegates with an accredited **Level 3 - Emergency First Aid at Work qualification.**

Subjects covered include:

- Role of the First Aider
- Primary survey
- Dealing with an unresponsive casualty
- Recovery position
- Resuscitation (**Adult, Child and Baby CPR** including the safe use of an AED)
- Choking
- Minor injuries
- Wounds, bleeding and shock
- Asthma
- Fractures
- Foreign bodies
- Seizures
- Burns

The training is being offered at a special rate of £75.00pp inclusive of all course materials, manuals, certification and refreshments.
