Congratulations to the children below for receiving their skills builders last week.










#### <u>Oak</u>

#### Introducing Studio Ninja

Developed in collaboration between Red Butler Music School and the charity Beautiful Noise, Studio Ninja is a music tuition programme designed to introduce young people to the basics of songwriting, as well as digital music recording and production tools, in a fun and collaborative learning environment.



Studio Ninja is delivered as a weekly, hour-long course featuring ongoing tutor-led learning. During the course, we might also explore physical instruments like drums, guitars, keyboards, singing, and the ukulele.

Club Cost - £8.00 per session or £24 per month. A number of funded places are available for children with special educational needs and disabilities and those eligible for free school meals.

Timings - Mondays after school 3.30 - 4.30pm

#### From Term 1, the course structure is as follows:

- Weeks 1 and 2: Introduce the elements that make up a music track, song structures, and the role of digital music tools in capturing and manipulating sounds. This section uses Chrome Music Lab, which makes it easy to create music and practise at home.
- Weeks 3 and 4: Build on the skills developed, using BandLab to allow for greater creative expression by constructing songs with multiple tracks, utilising a wider range of instrumentation, rhythms, and effects.
- Week 5: Introduce the extensive library of samples and loops available in BandLab, enabling students to build tracks from pre-existing beats and samples.
- Week 6: Bring all the learning together, providing young people the opportunity to develop and showcase their tracks at the end of the term.


