# Federation Proposal Meeting - Minutes

Following the recent Federation meeting held on 9<sup>th</sup> September at East Hoathly, the following points were raised:

When asked about appointment of an Executive Headteacher, the Chair of Governors explained that this would occur in November and the permanent position would start from January 2016.

Parents asked about the timeline for the Federation vote. It was explained that the vote would happen on  $1^{st}$  October, rather than  $24^{th}$  October as originally thought.

Parents expressed a wish about wanting to know more about the governors and their aims for the school. Governors explained that they would develop individual profiles on the website and newsletter and suggested that they attended parent forums to explain to parents more about what the governors do and their strategic involvement in the school.

Parents asked if the Federation would mean there would be a change of teachers. Governors explained that the teachers would not change as a product of the Federation but that there would be an interview process for a permanent Executive Headteacher.

Also, you will find bags on pupil's pegs which will we be putting letters and any information for you to take home so could you please check them when you pick your child/ren up.


