As a previous teacher and Headteacher in Sussex and overseas in Botswana, I gained so much pleasure from seeing children excited by and enjoying their learning, while achieving the very best they can. Reception's Trip to Plumpton College




 Ensuring lights get turned off when the rooms are not being used.
