

Interesting Word of the Week

Term 2 Topics

Reception

Our topic next term is 'Noisy Nightlife'. We will be spending time learning about nocturnal animals and winter celebrations such as Bonfire night, Remembrance and Christmas. Our key texts will be Peace at Last, Owl Babies and The Jolly Christmas Postman.



Year 1 and 2

Our topic next term is 'The Super Seasons of Stickman'. We will be basing our learning around the changing seasons in Science and on the book 'Stick man' by Julia Donaldson. We will also be learning about our local area and East Hoathly Carnival. If the children have any pictures, photos or writing about any of these themes it would be lovely to share with the class. Every Thursday afternoon this term we will have Forest School so please can the children bring in their forest school kits.

Year 3 and 4

Next term, Year 3/4 class are learning about Ancient Greece. We will be reading myths and legends of Ancient Greece.

If you have any artefacts around Ancient Greece we would love to explore them in class!

Year 5 and 6

In Year 5/6 class next term, our topic will be The Victorians, with a focus on our local area in The Victorian times. We will be using 'The Street Child' by Berlie Doherty to help us make comparisons between the lifestyle then and now.

If you have any Victorian books or artefacts, we would love to share these in class.

Year 1 and 2 Recreation of the Fire of London!

On Tuesday 19^{th} October, Year 1 and 2 recreated the Fire of London. They described what happened afterwards.

"First we put our home made houses close together. Then Mr Herdman lit the first house. Next the fire spread to the next house and spread along the line of houses. The wind helped the fire to spread. Finally all that was left was ash and the fire died out. We knew our houses were being burnt but we could imagine that in 1666 the people would have been really sad."
