30 HOURS A WEEK NURSERY FUNDING FOR WORKING FAMILIES

You may be aware that 30 hours a week of free childcare for 3 & 4 year old children of working families will be available from September 2017.

The free childcare is available for families where:

- Both parents are working
- Each parent earns the equivalent of 16 hours a week at the national minimum or living wage, and earns less than £100,000 a year
- Or the sole parent is working in a lone-parent family

Please include all children under the age of 5, not just 3 and 4 year olds, as this will help plan for future needs.


