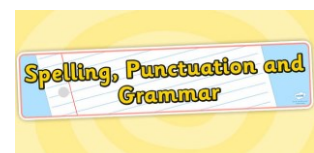
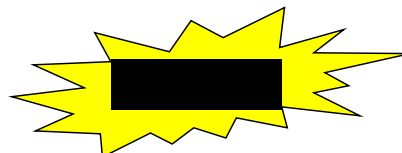
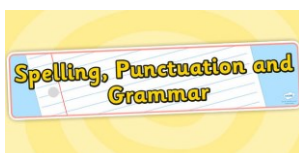
We made a total of £240.64.

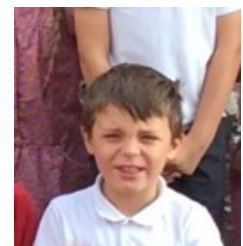

CLASS TOPICS - TERM 5

This Term's Topic

Reception Class

This term, Reception Class have the learning journey 'Glorious Growing!' We will be planting lots of seeds and talking about what they need to start to grow. Also we will be enjoying role play in our outdoor Garden Centre, where we will be discussing the names of different garden tools and experimenting with them.

This Term's Topic

Year 1/2 Class

This term, Year 1/2 class' topic is 'Famous People'. We will be learning about famous people from the past, all the way to people who are famous today: such as Florence Nightingale, Claude Monet, Barack Obama, David Beckham and a few more! We will look at why those people became famous, and will link our learning to the person we are learning about each week. We have already put the people in a timeline, and talked about what we would like to learn about each one, and are looking forward to learning all about these individuals!

This Term's Topic

Year 3/4 Class

This term, Year 3/4's topic is called 'Let's Explore Growing!' We are looking how plants grow and the functions within them. In science, we will be growing and investigating plants. In literacy, we are seeking inspiration from a variety of books, such as: "The Enormous Turnip", "Jack and the Beanstalk" and "The Oak Inside the Acorn". In art, we will be drawing and painting a variety of flowers! In Music, we will be adding music to different scenes from Jack and the Beanstalk. In geography, we will be learning about the points on a compass and drawing our own maps!

This Term's Topic

Year 5/6 Class

Year 5/6 class topic for term 5 is 'Codebreakers' and we will be using the text 'Stormbreaker' by Anthony Horowitz. We will also be doing a city study on London as this is where our text is set. In maths, we will be preparing for SATS by revising key concepts for the first couple of weeks and then we will move on to some exciting codebreaking activities.
