



Parent Forum - Tuesday 2nd May

We held a parent forum on Tuesday 2nd May to discuss a number of topics. The main focus of the forum was to gain parents views on homework - what they feel is suitable for their child's age, the kinds of homework and resources they would like to see and the frequency that they feel is appropriate.

The discussion had was very useful and the following were the key points made:

-all classes should have homework sent out and due back in on the same day

- KS1 homework to be focussed around times tables, reading and spellings

-KS2 homework to be times tables, Mathletics, reading and spellings/grammar

-Mathletics is a great way to introduce paperless homework which is similar to how local secondary schools deliver homework.

-It is important for KS2 children to be given and complete homework on time as it is good preparation for secondary school

-Family time is very important and there is a risk that homework could impact on this - one option to avoid this would be for homework to be sent out on a Monday and due in on a Friday, therefore avoiding the weekend.

-Some parents would like more homework that others - optional extras could be included for extension activities at home.

-make it clear that projects are optional and these to be celebrated in assembly/displayed in school.

We also discussed the content of Parent Forums from September for the 2017/18 school year. The following recommendation was made:

-specific meeting for support for parents with similar SEN needs with suggestions on how to support those children in their learning

e.g. Dyslexia support, ASD support, ADHD support etc.

Thank you to the parents who were able to attend. The staff will be taking on all of the feedback and look to put this into practice as soon as possible. If you were unable to attend the Forum but have other ideas that you would like to add to either of these discussion points, please see Miss Lewis or Mr Procter on the playground, or make an appointment at the school office.
