### Enterprise Week 15<sup>th</sup> - 19<sup>th</sup> May 2017

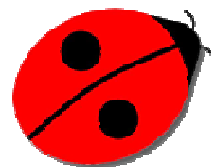
The week beginning Monday 15<sup>th</sup> May 2017 will be our **Enterprise Week**. Each class will be given a budget of £20.00. They will then use this to buy resources to make ladybird themed products to sell at the end of the week.

This is because we are supporting the Mayor of Lewes' charity Pestalozzi. You can find out more about this charity at <http://www.pestalozzi.org.uk/>. Their mission is to produce globally conscious young leaders by supporting their further education in the multi-cultural, multi-faith environment of the Pestalozzi International Community.
