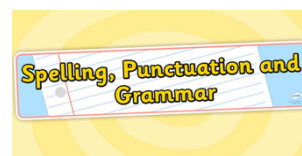
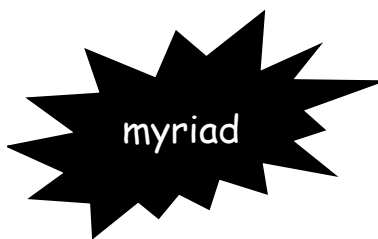
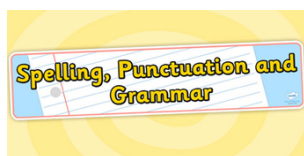

A countless or extremely great number of people or things.



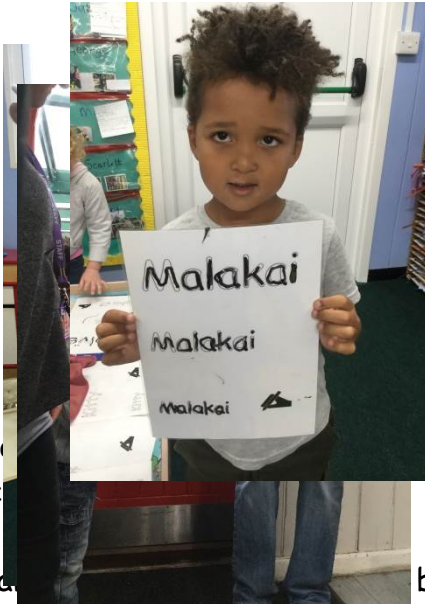
Nursery News
