


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

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Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope you have enjoyed reading about your child's individual achievements this year in their school reports. We also want to provide you with a brief summary about the pupil's progress and achievement from the end of key stages.

Progress across the school has been excellent with children continuing to make good and outstanding steps of progress this year. East Hoathly Primary compares very favourably with all East Sussex schools and nationally in outcomes and progress.

In Key Stage 2, attainment in maths, reading, writing and grammar, punctuation and spelling exceeds the national results, continuing the upward trend seen over the last 5 years. Progress is excellent and way above national for reading, writing and maths.

In Key Stage 1, attainment in maths, reading and writing significantly exceeds the national and county results.

90% of Year 1 children passed the phonic screening assessment, exceeding the national outcome.

Reception progress is fantastic, exceeding national and county figures. 83% of pupils achieving a good level of development.

More details of the end of key stage outcomes will be put onto the school website.

Another fantastic year! We would like to thank all the children and staff for their hard work and determination. We would also like to thank you for your support and look forward to continue to build on these amazing results next year!


