



Pupil Discipline Policy

Following feedback from parents, staff have worked to refine the Pupil Discipline Policy which is attached to this newsletter. The main changes are as follows:

- The <u>star work</u> will now be celebrated with another class and their teacher, with the work being shared and a sticker being given to the child by the other teacher. This will no longer be celebrated in the newsletter.
- A new <u>'Head Teacher's Award'</u> will be introduced, which will be a celebration of fantastic learning and progress from children. The aim of this is that it will be awarded to each child once per year. This will be celebrated in the newsletter.
- If a child is on the <u>Thundercloud</u>, they will be given a reflection sheet to complete which ensures the child considers the choices they have made and the element of the school code of conduct that has been broken. This is to ensure parents and children can follow up with discussions at home. Parents will receive a letter from the school to inform them of this.

The Homework Policy

Following consultation with parents at the end of last term, staff have amended the Federation Homework Policy which is attached to the end of this newsletter. The main changes are as follows:

- Homework for ALL year groups will go out on Fridays and be due on Thursdays.
- All maths homework will be done through Mathletics, this should be done with minimal support from parents.
- All children will be able to attend homework club at lunchtimes in their classrooms if they are unable to complete homework at home.
- Paper homework will have an indicator on it of the level of support required from parents.
- -Half termly projects will remain optional and will be celebrated on the second Thursday assembly of each term with the whole school.
