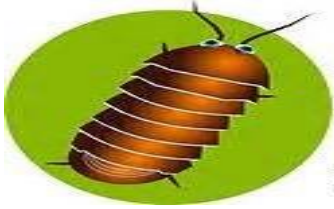

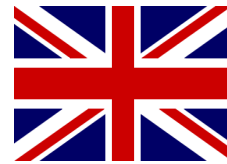

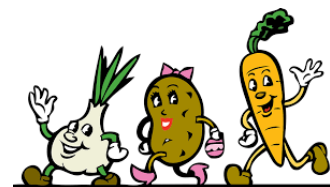
Menu Change
