

<u>Jam Club</u>


Jam club is a 'Jesus and Me' club and teaches children more about God and the bible through stories, songs and activities.


Next week, we will be looking forward to our Christingle Service.




<u>Reception</u>

Next term, Year 3 and 4's topic is going to be 'Where In The World Are We?'




<u>Year 1 and 2</u>






