







### Year 3 and 4 Breadmaking


On Tuesday 19th March 2019, Year 3 and 4 made our very own bread rolls. Firstly, we washed our hands! Then, we were put into groups of 6 and carefully read the recipe and list of ingredients.

Each group had a team leader who decided which children completed which role. Everyone got the chance to do something. When we had weighed out and mixed all our dry ingredients together, we had to let our dough 'prove' for an hour (just like the Great British Bake Off!)

Finally, it was time to bake them! We were all really happy with how they turned out and we ate them after lunch with jam, ham or marmite. Mostly they were delicious! We had a great morning and learnt lots about how to follow a recipe.







### Forest School

This week, Year 3 and 4 went onto the field and played the centipede game. Maxym in Year 4 explained, "The centipede game is a non-speaking trust game. Three people standing in a row with their hands on the shoulders of the person in front and the person at the back directs the two in the front by steering the line of people while the front two have their eyes closed. It's really tricky, but fun!"

After, they had the opportunity to use secateurs to cut up branches and twigs, which they brought back to their classroom. The children used colourful string, feathers and other natural materials to create wind catchers.

Monday 13 May 2019—English grammar, punctuation and spelling papers 1 and 2

Tuesday 14 May 2019—English reading

- \* Arrangements for children:
- o SATs week breakfast available each morning to settle them in
- o Most papers will begin at 9.30/9.45am to give children chance to settle in
- o Access arrangements are available for children:
- \* School leaders will apply for extra time in advance for children should they need it
- \* Scribe or transcription can be provided for children who's handwriting it likely to be tricky to read
- \* Readers are available, children will need to ask staff to read questions to them
- o Rest breaks are available throughout each test, should the child require them.
- o Most children will sit the papers in the hall they have got used to this following regular practice.
- \* Writing assessment:
- o Not 'tested' in the same way
- o Teachers make a judgement based on child's writing from across the curriculum
- o This is moderated within the local authority

### KS1:

- \* There is no 'timetable' for testing, but they must be completed within the month of May.
- \* Papers support the teacher's assessment of children's classroom work
- \* Children complete independently, in small groups or 1:1 with the teacher
- \* Children won't be told they are taking a test just that they are going to do a special activity with the teacher.
- \* All children will be given the opportunity to complete each paper.
- \* There is no time limit for the tests to be completed.
- \* The question can be read to them during the maths paper.

### Sports Clubs / Instructors

Following last year's successful 'Sports Week' where all the children took part in different sporting and physical activities across the week, we are beginning to plan this years to link in with our Sports Day. If you are a member of an existing club or know a club or anyone who would be interested in running workshops for the children, please let the office know, so information can be passed onto the PE Co-ordinator.







For those who may want an easier start the Ukulele can be a great place to look, we focus on simple songs that everyone can play and recognise!


Lessons days are still being tbc although it is likely they will be in the second half of the school day.


