Mrs White will be teaching in the Year 5 and 6 classroom on Thursdays, while Miss Purcell is out of class.

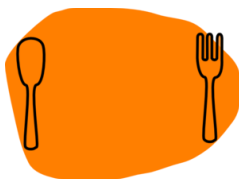


Menu Change

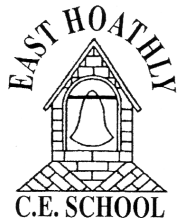
The forum will be held in the Learning Zone at 9.00am.
