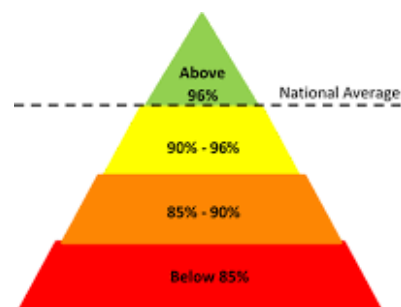

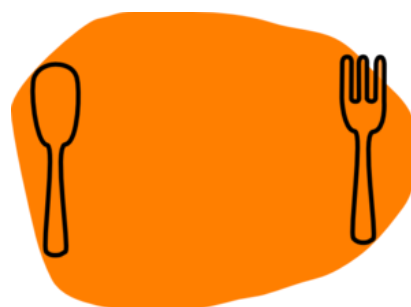

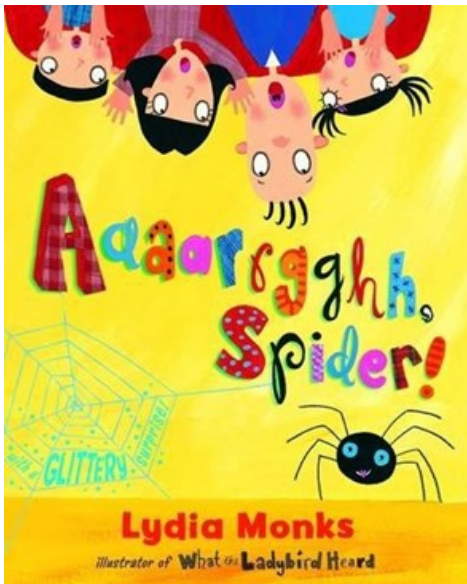
Nursery News

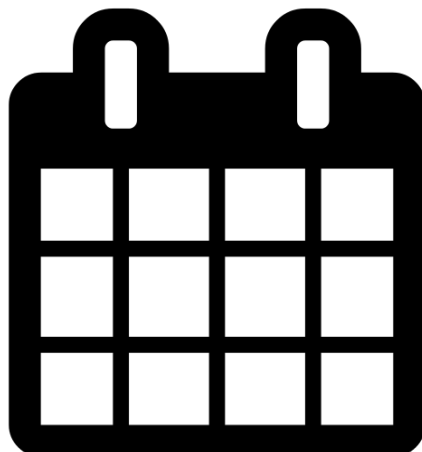
