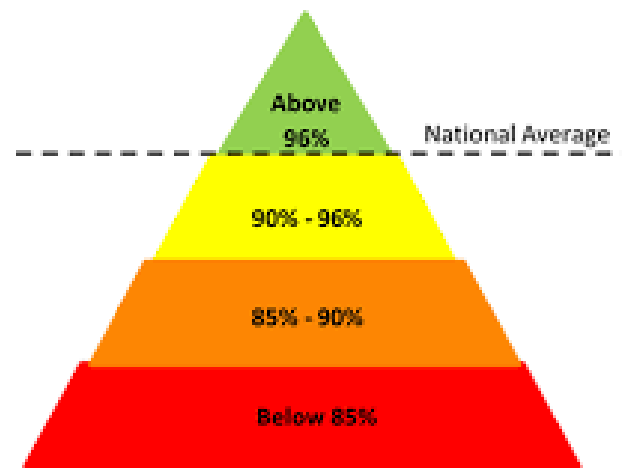

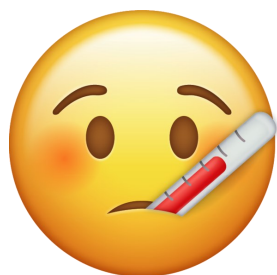

If your child would like to take part, please remind them to attend choir club at school with Miss Lewis this term.





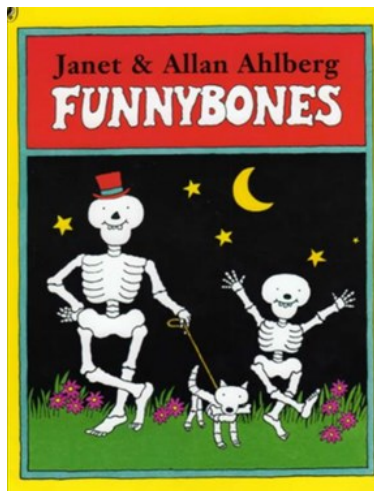
Nursery News

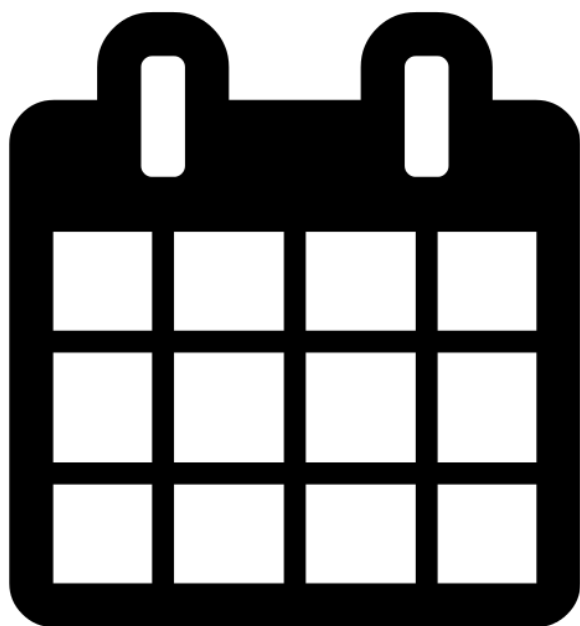

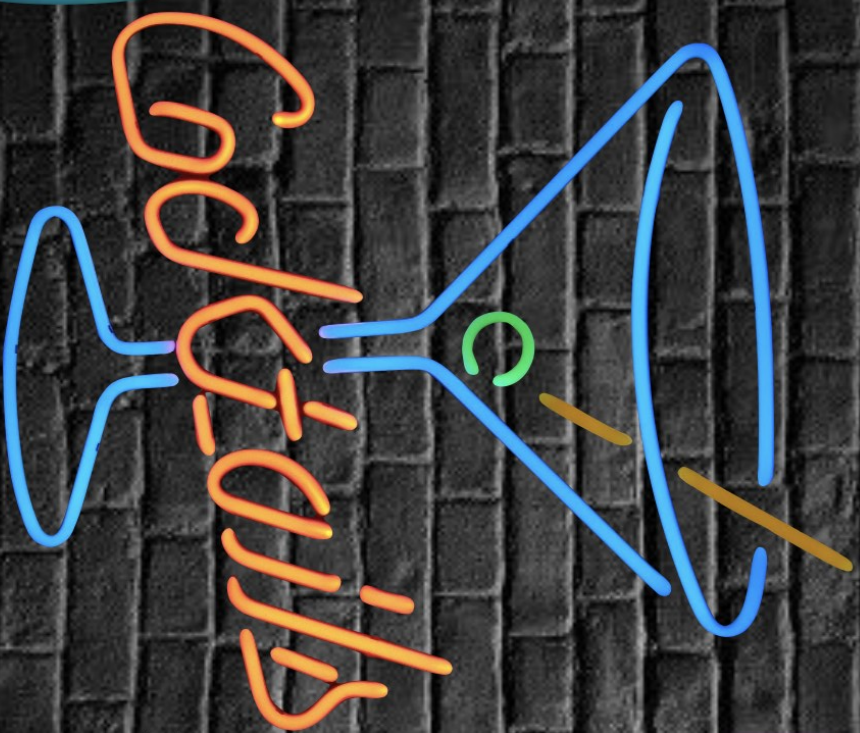
