
'What happens where I live? Year 1 and 2 Newsletter Term 2 2019

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Dear Parents,

This term we are beginning an exciting new topic – What happens where I live? We will be learning about our local area, how it has changed and authors that live locally.

Some of the key texts we will be using for our learning are:



If you would like a learning activity to complete at home during this term with your child, you can choose from one of these activities:

- To create a map of the local area,
- Make a sculpture of a local landmark e.g Herstmonceux castle,
- To create an information leaflet about a local town.

The learning map attached to this newsletter outlines the areas we will be learning about and some of the work we will be doing in teacher-focussed activities and group work. We are also placing an emphasis on continuing to learn times tables through maths sessions and at home.

	understanding of what they are reading as comprehension and discussion are key		
	reading skills in Year 1 and 2.
