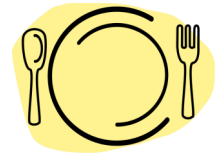

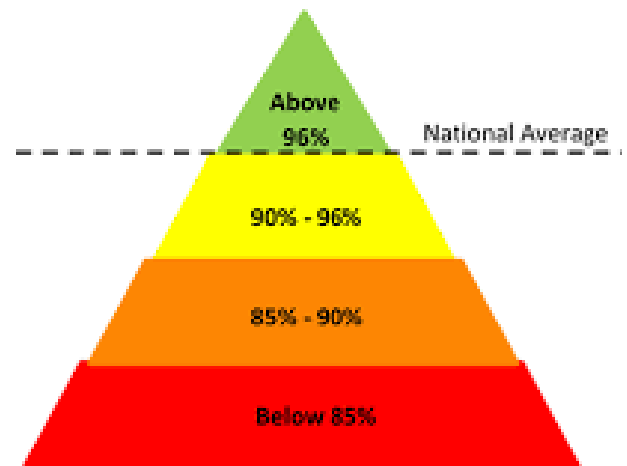

Luke Stacey for brilliant descriptive writing about a house in Literacy.

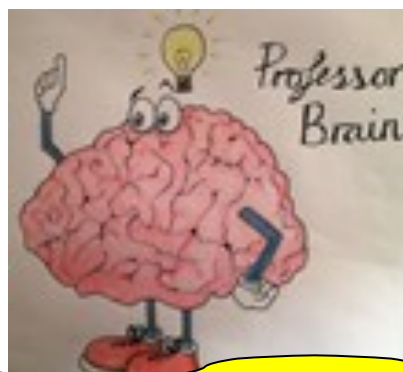
Alexandra Zorn for an incredible, descriptive piece of writing about a dream home.

I'm Inspector Ingenious because I designed an artistic book cover for the class topic board.

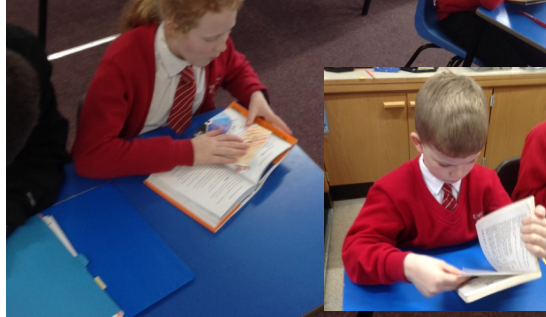


I am a Captain Britain because I always follow rules when playing games.

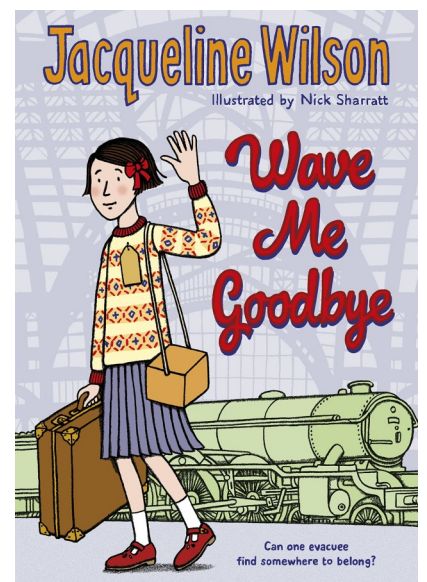
The book I am recommending is: 'Wave Me Goodbye' by Jacqueline Wilson

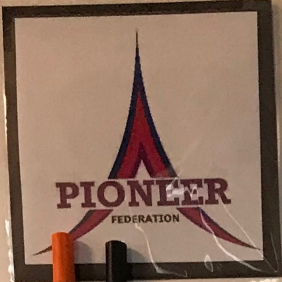
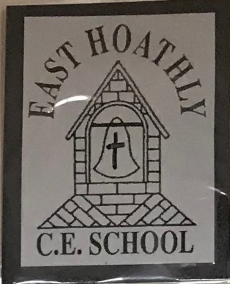
I recommend this book because:

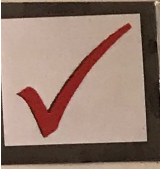
