











Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you have had a good break and are ready for our final term together! Our topic for Term 6 is ‘Inside Out’ and we will be using the text ‘There’s a boy in the girl’s bathroom’ by Louis Sachar to support our learning.

Reading	Please read with your child at least three times a week at home and ensure that their reading record is signed and dated.
Spellings	Spelling tests are every Thursday and your child will be tested on the spelling pattern they have learnt about that week. Sometimes they will have to investigate a spelling pattern themselves and apply what they have learnt in the test.
Maths	Maths homework will be set on a Tuesday and will be expected to have been completed by Monday. Parents are encouraged to sit with their child during homework to support. Year 6 Maths homework is usually set in their CGP Arithmetic books, but may also be investigations or revision of what we have been learning in class.
Times Tables	Children will learn their tables and practise these in school at least twice a week. Each child has a Times Table Rockstars login and should be practising their tables (either on this website or in another way) three times a week at home. Children should have quick recall of times tables to 12, as well the related division facts. (i.e. $3 \times 8 = 24$; 24 divided by $8 = 3$ etc)
Grammar	Grammar homework will be sent home on a Tuesday and your child will have two weeks to complete this. The homework will be based on the grammar they will be learning within their literacy lessons. To help with our in-class assessments, please indicate when you have helped your child.

Reminders – Please can you make sure your child brings in a water bottle each day with fresh water; ensure all jumpers are labelled and bring a coat for any wet weather. PE will be on **Tuesdays and Wednesdays (the children can wear their PE kit to school with their school jumper over it).**

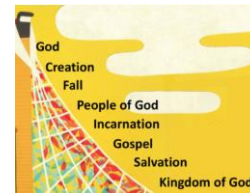
