<u>Hedgehog's Curriculum Letter</u> 'Splash!' What do we know about water?




Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope you've had an enjoyable Easter Break and are ready for term 5. Our Water topic is going to run over two terms. We are going to being learning about 'Under the Water' first and then, after May half term, we will be learning about things that happen 'Above the Water'.

We will be enjoying finding out about how essential water is, where it comes from, what we need it for and how we can look after our water sources.

Our key texts this term will be:









Areas of Learning:

Literacy – We will be continuing to focus on using high frequency words in our writing as well as spelling words with more than one syllable. We will also be writing our own stories based on the texts we are reading, as well as looking closely at the characters, settings and events of the stories we are sharing. We will be exploring other genres of writing such as postcards and our fact files.

Maths – In Maths, we will be solving problems that apply all of the skills we have learnt so far. As well as this, we will be continuing to develop our knowledge of number, addition, number bonds, practising doubling and halving as well as noticing patterns in our number system. We will be thinking about 3D shapes, where we may notice these and their properties.

In other areas of the EYFS, we will be making links with our water theme, such as learning about things that float and sink and why this happens. We will be thinking about our impact on the water system and finding out about different underwater species.

We will also be exploring and celebrating the Queens Platinum Jubilee and finding out about traditions in her family and in ours. If you have any family photos, or knowledge of your wider family tree please feel free to share this with us as part of this learning.
