<u>Sun Cream</u>

Common food allergens can actually be found in some sun creams. It's important you read the inactive ingredient list before giving your child sun cream if they have a food allergy. In addition, we have children at school with serious nut allergies so please be mindful of this when applying sun cream to your child or sending them into school with some.

Ingredients to look out for:

Peanut allergy - avoid arachidyl glucoside or arachidyl alcohol, which are peanut derivatives

Tree nut allergy - avoid sweet almond oil, argan oil, ginkgo biloba

Soy allergy - sunscreens and skin creams can be soy enriched to help prevent UV damage

Wheat allergy - wheat and wheat germ is added to many creams


