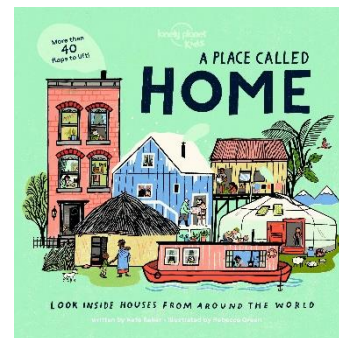
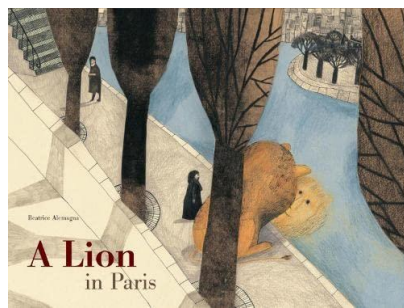
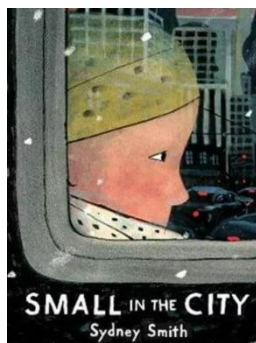


Squirrel Class Newsletter Term 2 2022

Please have a go at some of these at home:























- Make a model of a city landmark using junk modelling, construction kits, Lego, or blocks and take a photo of it to share.

Home Learning

Reading	<p>Please read with your child at least three times a week, even if it is just for 5 minutes. When reading with your child, please ensure it is signed and dated. We have introduced our new reading scheme for Year 1 (and some children in Year 2) using Little Wandle books – please read the letter sent home last term carefully, extra copies are available on the school website or from the school office.</p> <p>During reading sessions, please discuss the story with your child and ask them questions about what they are reading. These questions will help to develop their understanding of what they have read, comprehension and discussion are key reading skills in Year 1 and 2.</p> <p>Children can change their reading books, within their book band, at any time from our class library.</p>
Spellings and phonics	<p>On a Monday, the children will be sent home with spellings based on the spelling curriculum rules and phonics sounds they have been taught during the week. There will be an optional test which the Year 2 children can choose to take part in on the following Monday.</p>
Maths	<p>A maths challenge will be set on a Monday and will need to be returned on the following Monday. The children can bring it back in whenever they have finished it during that week and put it in the 'finished homework' box.</p> <p>Also, it would be useful for the children to start to practise their times tables. Year 1 children should be learning 10x, 2x and 5x tables. When secure with the 2x, 5x and 10x tables, children should be moving onto 3x and 4x tables.</p> <p>BBC Bitesize website has links to times tables songs that children can learn. https://www.bbc.com/bitesize/topics/zqbg87h</p>
