

# NSPCC SPEAK OUT STAY SAFE

#### **Hedgehogs**



Hedgehogs spent the morning together and watched the virtual assembly for the NSPCC's Speak Out and Stay Safe campaign. Following this, we spent some time together talking about what trust means, who the people are that we trust and why we trust them. We also spoke about how in different places we might have different people who we trust, like between home and school or afterschool clubs.

#### Squirrels



For the NSPCC assembly Squirrel class learnt about the 'Speak up Speak out' campaign to keep children safe. Next, the children designed a friend for 'Buddy' who could help him support children who needed advice.



#### Foxes



Foxes children created the Childline number using actions with their hands. This was a simple way we learnt to recite the number.



#### <u>Owls</u>



On Tuesday 28th of March, Owls class had a visit from some volunteers from the NSPCC. During our workshop we discussed different ways that we can stay safe and the importance of speaking out. We also considered how to stay safe online and the steps that we take to do so. Owls ended the session considering adults that help them feel safe, places they feel safe and items that help to feel safe.



# News from Foxes



Foxes have been learning about the ancient civilization of the Mayans. We found out that they used symbols to communicate words and numbers. We had a go at creating our own. We then transferred the print into a block print using string and card. We then used the tile to create a print.

This week in our PALs Assembly we enjoyed sharing our learning from this term with our friends across the school.

#### Nursery Forest School

#### Wednesday 15th March

Nursery set off for the woods together on a beautiful bright morning. On the way the children each had a toy bird to fly to the woods. They were great at recalling some of the bird names; robin, blackbird, blue tit and woodpecker from their last session. The children looked out for and listened for birds and spotted some crows, saw a tiny robin in the tree singing and heard woodpeckers tapping away at trees, in search of food.

We talked about the bluebells and why we are not going to play in the woods for a few weeks, to preserve these beautiful plants on the woodland floor.

The children had a go at climbing onto the dinosaur tree and finding spots for their birds to rest and nest on the tree.

"The tree looks like a bird...it has fallen down"

"My chaffinch wants to peck at the tree to find food"

There was lots of time for climbing and physical challenges at the turtle mound. The children were interested in climbing small trees and investigating the ground. They found chestnut cases which were really spiky, lots of moss and clay and rabbit holes. They also enjoyed playing with the dried, fallen leaves on the floor. It was great fun throwing them up in the air and watching how they fell. The children found hazel catkins on the ground and collected lots of them.

"They are soft...they are wiggly...they are like worms...this one is longer"

When the children got back to the nursery, they used some hay to make nests for their birds had a great time playing with them. There was time to create some beautiful, colourful birds from card, chalk pastels and sticks. Some of the children used the catkins they had collected in the woods as worms; food for their birds.















#### Owls Forest School - Wednesday 29th March

As the spring equinox (eui- equal, nox- night) has come, the bluebells are growing in the woodland, so to preserve these amazing plants, the Owls had their session on a wet field this week.

After learning a song about spring the class were introduced to the game of 'Giants, Wizards, Elves'. They had to work as a team to decide which magical creature they would be, in a game similar to 'rock, paper, scissors'.

The children all played a game of 'Spirit of the forest' where they had to dodge the spirit of the forest, without being turned into trees. Through the game the class learned about different aspects of a woodland and how the balance of trees and animals are important to the health and development of this ecosystem.

Owls had a scavenger hunt, where they followed clues to various locations around the school field site. Once they had decoded the riddles, they found some Easter treats!

Lots of the class explored and played independently, making up games, making dens and creating with wood and tools.

They learned how to use a pruning saw safely with a saw horse, to cut their wood to length. Once the children had shown an understanding of safe tool use, some moved onto using knives to start to carve with. They had a go at peeling bark, sharpening the ends of sticks and some started to create patterns on their work.

Some of the children went on to make their own pens out of elder, by pushing holes in the soft centre of the wood and inserting charcoal.


There was time to continue exploring the pond area. A group of children cleared some winter debris and found evidence of newts, frogspawn and other life.
