

News from Nursery





For Harvest, we looked at why we celebrate and give thanks for the food we eat. The children were interested in how food grow!

We explored fruits and vegetables and how some grow in tress and some grow in the ground.

We learnt a song all about how a bean grows and this taught us what a bean needs to grow.

The children performed this in the church.

To add to this we created art using a variety of media to show the different parts of the beans cycle.

We made a bean using paint, a raincloud using our hand prints and hands as the rain, a sun using collage and a bean stalk out of tissue paper - the children each made a pea pod with three peas inside. This helped us to remember the aspects of the song work on our fine motor skills and count our peas as we placed them into our pea pods.

In Hedgehogs Class we had great fun making sheep hats for the Harvest Festival. We sang 'The Farmer Plants the Seeds' for everyone in the Church and enjoyed showing everyone what we have been practicing!





News from Squirrels Class



In Science, Squirrels were learning about the human body. Year 2 thought about the effects of exercise on the body. They did different exercises for differing amounts of time and considered how this affects the breaths they were taking. Year 1 learnt about the lungs and their affects on the body. They created a lung collage, which you can see on display in the corridor.





News from Foxes Class



Foxes' last two weeks of term have certainly been busy! We spent one morning creating our lightboxes from our DT lessons and what an amazing result! It was so lovely to see how hard they worked on their designs and how excited they were to turn the lights on and see the finished product!

Nursery Forest School

Wednesday 11th October 2023

We got ourselves in wellies and coats ready for a first adventure down to Forest School. On the walk down to the woods we looked at the trees and the plants along the way. The children noticed that some were "spiky" and some were

"stingy" pointing out that we don't touch those ones. Half way there we came across a large fallen tree; some of the children climbed on the lower end and shuffled their way up the tree trunk.

the knowledge the children have gained from the Forest School experience.

The impact can be seen through the skills gained, tools used, art and craft activities, observations and knowledge of the

fruit, plants trees in relation to the seasons and the skills involved in learning how to play Forest School games.

ONLINE CONTENT

10 tips to keep your children safe online

The internet has transformed the ability to access content. Many apps that children use are dependent on user-generated content which can encourage freedom of expression, imagination and creativity. However, due to the sheer volume uploaded every day, it can be difficult for platforms to regulate and moderate everything, which means that disturbing or distressing images, videos or audio clips can slip through the net. That's why we've created this guide to provide parents and carers with some useful tips on keeping children safe online.



MONITOR VIEWING HABITS

Whilst most apps have moderation tools, inappropriate content can still slip through the net.



CHECK ONLINE CONTENT

Understand what's being shared or what seems to be 'trending' at the moment.



CHECK AGE-RATINGS

Make sure they are old enough to use the app and meet the recommended age-limit.



CHANGE PRIVACY SETTINGS

Make accounts private and set content filters and parental controls where possible.



SPEND TIME ON THE APP

Get used to how apps work, what content is available and what your child likes to watch.



LET CHILDREN KNOW YOU'RE THERE

Ensure they know that there is support and advice available to them if they need it.



ENCOURAGE CRITICAL THINKING

Talk about what people might post online and why some posts could cause distress.



LEARN HOW TO REPORT & BLOCK Always make sure that children know how to use the reporting

SEEK FURTHER SUPPORT

If a child has been affected by something they've seen online, seek support from your school's safeguarding lead.



KEEP AN OPEN DIALOGUE

If a child sees distressing material online listen to their concerns, empathise and offer reassurance.
