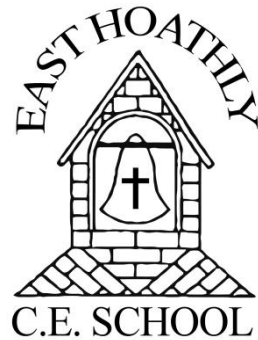

Curriculum

Our exciting, broad and balanced curriculum is developed through a 2 year cycle for each cohort. Each term has a focussed cross-curricular topic, lasting 5-7 weeks. Before each topic begins, teachers find out what pupils already know and what they would like to find out about, then use this information to influence their planning of the topics. Each topic ends with a post assessment to find out what new knowledge pupils have now gained. Within the curriculum maps, the Maths and Literacy units of work are also sequenced and the wide ranging Literacy texts are listed.

The planned trips linked to the topics are also represented in the curriculum maps. We also timetable 'Enrichment Days', 'Forest School' and 'Bespoke Curriculum Events' to further enrich our curriculum and enable us to cater for current global affairs and issues.

What makes East Hoathly so special?

Forest School: Forest School is an inspirational process that offers all learners regular opportunities to achieve and develop confidence and self-esteem through hands-on learning experiences in a woodland or natural environment with trees. Forest School is the name of a specific ethos – a way of working with people in an outdoor natural space for an extended period of time, often a full year. Qualified practitioners carefully facilitate programmes which are uniquely tailored to the needs of the individuals within the group and have the fundamental aim of building participants' **self-esteem, confidence, independence and creativity.**



Events and curriculum enrichment:

We run a variety of special weeks and events throughout the school year. These vary from productions, services and performances to International Days, Wellbeing events and whole-school off-timetable days. We run regular, bespoke, events which are designed to meet the needs of the children and develop their learning in a variety of areas. We plan these special events in addition



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to the national annual events and class-based trips, events and themes.



These events allow us to fully enrich our curriculum with exciting, meaningful learning experiences that give the children lasting memories of their time in primary school.
