Term 3 saw us dive into learning about animals. The children loved exploring animals from around the globe, having our own chicks hatch in the classroom and learning about animals at Drusillas! In term 4, we will be looking at oceans and why we should keep them safe. The children will explore materials in science linked to the impact onto the ocean, write poetry and explore one of the biggest events too happen within an ocean; the sinking of the Titanic. Reading	Please read with your child at least three times a week , even if it is just for 5 minutes. Whe reading with your child, please acknowledge the fact that the book has been read by <u>signin</u> <u>and dating in the reading record book</u> .		
	During reading sessions, please discuss the story with your child and ask them questions about what they are reading. These questions will help to develop their understanding of what they are reading as comprehension and discussion are key reading skills in Year 1 and 2. Little Wandle Phonics books will be changed every Friday. If your child does not return the previous weeks book, they will not be sent home with a change of book the next week. Beyond this, children will be on a coloured reading phase and can change these as frequently as they need to.		
Phonics	Most children in Squirrels will be sent home with a phonics homework sheet on a Frida which will share the sounds, sentences and spelling we will be covering during the week. Th children can share their learning with you. There will not be a formal spelling test fo Squirrels, however there will always be 5 words at the bottom of the sheet that they hav learnt in school that week and it would be great to practise these at home too! Their phonic and spellings all fit in with the new reading scheme.		
	Some children in Squirrels will be given tasks related to the Year 1 and 2 common exceptio words to practice, on a Friday. Again, there will be no formal spelling test for squirrel However, we will be focusing on 5 words a week and it would be great to practise these o home too!		
Maths	Maths homework will be set from a new CPG book. It will be set on a Friday and need to be returned on the following Friday. The children can bring it back in whenever they have finished it during that week and put it in the 'finished homework' box.		

Useful information and reminders:

- Please can you make sure your child brings in a water bottle and their book bag each day. •
- The children will need a **named coat, hat and gloves** in school as the weather starts to get colder and wetter.
- Our PE days are **Thursdays and Fridays** so please send your child into school in their PE on these days.

Miss Goymer (the student teacher supporting Squirrels) will be with us for the first three weeks of this term before she heads back to University to finish of her teacher training.
