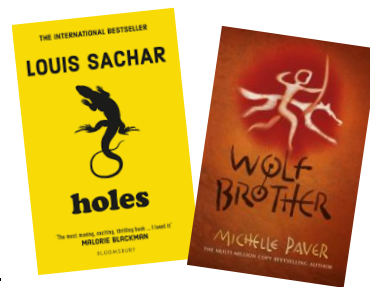




Term 3 2025-2026 Eagles' Class newsletter 'What makes a hospitable environment?'

Wishing you a Happy New Year! We hope you have had a restful break and a lovely Christmas! This term, we are starting a new geography topic based around 'What makes a hospitable environment?'. We will be using Wolf Brother by Michelle Paver, and Holes by Louis Sachar, as inspiration in our writing. Our focus in Geography moves from Europe across the Atlantic to learn about North America and in R.E. We will be learning more about Hinduism. In maths, we will be finishing off fractions before moving onto looking at decimals and then area, perimeter and volume.

This term's homework will be Maths and Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling learning, based on areas we have looked at in Term 1. The homework will be sent home in week 1 and can be handed in any time before the end of the term. As always, this work is to ensure that the children can be independent in their learning and have time to practice and consolidate different areas. If there are any areas that they are finding difficult, please bring it in and I am happy to work with them.

It is always great to have items that support our topic, so if anyone has any items that may help us with any of the work above that we could borrow, we would love to share in school.





























Reminders – Please can you make sure your child brings in a labelled water bottle each day with fresh water; ensure all jumpers are labelled and bring a coat for any wet weather.
