


'What makes animals unique?' Year 1 and 2 Newsletter Term 3 2025-2026

Resources for this term:

<u>Computing:</u> small plastic bottles and decorative materials such as foil, plastic packaging, paper of different colours, sequins, tissue paper, etc.

<u>Science:</u> any old animal toys your children do not use at home. Any brown shades of play doh.

Useful information and reminders:

- Please can you make sure your child brings in a **water bottle** and their **book bag** each day. We use their books daily so these need to be placed in a box as they come into the classroom.
- The children will need a named coat, hat and gloves in school as the weather starts to get colder and wetter.
- Our PE days are **Mondays and Fridays** so please send your child into school in their PE on these days.

Home Learning

Please read with your child <u>at least</u> three times a week, even if it is just for 5 minutes. When reading with your child, please acknowledge the fact that the book has been read Reading by recording this on Boom Reader. If you need a reminder of your Boom Reader Log in then ask Mrs Tucker. During reading sessions, please discuss the story with your child and ask them questions about what they are reading. These questions will help to develop their understanding of what they are reading as comprehension and discussion are key reading skills in Year 1 and 2. Squirrels are encouraged to change their books regularly, please can you help remind your child when their books need changing. Attached to the newsletter you will find our Weekly Phonics overview- please read **Phonics** through these words with your child at home to supplement the Phonics teaching we Year 1 will be completing in class. We will not be setting weekly Spellings. Spelling Please practice the attached spellings from Little Wandle, we will also be practising these Year 2 in class.
